Autumn Humor


Q: How do you fix a cracked pumpkin? A: A pumpkin patch

Make a Paper Ball Bat

With the help of your parents, make your very own paper ball bat!

Supplies

- Black paper we used regular black print paper
- Scissors (and/or paper trimmer)
- Glue
- Wiggle eyes or wiggly eye stickers (or white paper and black marker)

Step by Step:

- 1. Cut paper strips. You will need 4 paper strips per one bat. We cut ours along the width of a regular sheet of paper and they were about a "finger" wide.
- 2. Glue the two paper strips together, at a right angle (making the cross shape).
- 3. Glue the other two paper strips on top of the first two. Distribute them evenly (they should look like a snowflake).
- 4. Next, glue the paper strips together on the top.
- 5. Continue gluing all strips to top until a ball shape if formed.
- 6. Draw wings on black paper and cut them out (we folded the paper in half, cutting two wings at the same time).
- 7. Fold the wings at the end.
- 8. Apply glue on the fold and stick to the little black paper ball you made.
- 9. Stick on two googly eyes or wiggle eye stickers.
- 10. You just made your paper ball bat craft. Now make a few more and decorate your room!
